Teaching and Examination Related Guidelines

- 1. Total Number of Lectures Assigned As per UGC Norms are 45 and marks for theory examination is of Total 90 Marks.
- 2. Unit Wise and Case Study Based Breakup of 45 Lectures and Marks out of 90 are recommended as follows:

Unit 1: Introduction	(6 hours)	9 Marks
Unit 2: Individual Behaviour	(9 hours)	18 Marks
Unit 3: Communication and Motivation	(12 hours)	18 Marks
Unit 4: Group Behaviour and Leadership`	(12 hours)	18 Marks
Unit 5: Dynamics of Organisational Behaviour	(6 hours)	9 Marks
Compulsory Case Study		10 Marks
Two Short Notes		8 Marks

Note:

- **A.** Compulsory Case Study of 10 Marks must be covered based on the topics Motivation, Group Behaviour and Leadership, Organisational Culture, Organisational Change and Stress Management etc.
- **B.** Case Study should be of moderate size only to create the understanding of the subject and to ensure active participation of the students and continuous learning process.
- **C.** Two short names of 8 marks in the format of attempt any two (i.e. 4 marks each) out of the units covering less weightage.
- **D.** Recommended Readings Under Unit 2 Leaning Topic: Classical Conditioning theory, Operant Conditioning theory, Cognitive Learning Theory and Social Learning Theory.
- **E.** Recommended Readings Under Unit 4 Leadership Topic: Leadership vs Manager, Great Man and Trait Theory, Likert's Style, Michigan Studies, Managerial Grid Theory, House Path Goal Theory.
- **F.** Total number of questions will be five. All questions will carry equal weightage i.e. 18 marks of each. All the topics and sub topics should be covered from the books mentioned in References.
- **G.** First four questions serially marked from 1 to 4 will be of 18 marks each with internal choice format requiring comprehensive coverage of entire syllabus, must be asked and there should not be more than two parts in a question.

H. Question Number 5 will be based on compulsory one case study of moderate size without any choice of 10 marks in second part and first part will be based on short notes of 8 marks in the format of attempt any two (i.e. 4 marks each) out of four covering less weightage units in Q1 to Q5.
